DEEP SHADOW SOCKS INFO

YARN

Fingering to DK/ worsted weight yarn, in one or more colours.

Use table on page 3 as a guide to approximate yardage for your size, but be aware that this is only a rough guide.

Details for the yarn used in the pattern can be found on page 4.

NEEDLES

Dpns or circulars for your preferred method of working small circumferences in the round.

This pattern can be used for any method of knitting small circumferences in the round.

The socks are knit in the round, with a stitch count that won't fit comfortably around standard circular needles. This means that you'll need to use a special method for knitting small circumferences in the round. The traditional option is a set of double pointed needles. Longer circulars can be used for the "magic loop" or "two circulars" techniques.

If you're a newer knitter and haven't yet tried any of these techniques practice on a swatch in a yarn that's double knitting weight or thicker. Once you've decided which technique to use for your socks stick with that method throughout.

SWATCHING

This pattern includes multiple gauges, so that you can use the gauge you get with your chosen yarn. Before casting on your socks I recommend knitting a swatch of st st in the round.

Socks need to be knit in a dense, firm fabric so that they don't wear out too quickly. Refer to the table below for suggested needle sizes and a gauge range to aim for with standard yarn weights, note that these needle sizes are smaller than the usual sizes suggested for non sockspecific yarns.

Cast-on enough stitches to give you 6" / 15 cm using the suggested gauge for your yarn. Eg. for sport weight I'm aiming for 7.5-8 stitches per 1" / 2.5cm. To be safe I'll multiply the larger of those numbers by 6, which means I need to cast on 48 stitches.

Join in the round and knit every round until you have about 3" / 7.5cm of length. Bind off.

Wash and block your swatch before measuring your gauge.

Take a moment to assess the fabric of your swatch. If you're happy with how it feels, measure how many stitches you have over 2" / 5cm and divide the result by two. You'll use this number to find your row in the multi-gauge tables in the pattern (see following page). If the fabric feels loose, floppy or you can see gaps between the stitches try swatching again on a smaller needle size.

SIZING

The finished foot and ankle circumference should be approximately 10% smaller than the wearer's actual measurements, while the foot length should be approximately 5% shorter than the wearer's actual foot length.

The proportion of foot length to circumference are based on averages – everyone's feet and fit preferences are different! For best results measure your, or your gift recipient's, feet and subtract 10% from the circumference and 5% from the length to find your size. If necessary you can easily combine the circumference from one size with the foot length of another.

If you're knitting a surprise gift and don't have measurements and know your recipient's shoe size we've included corresponding shoe sizes in EU sizing (conversion charts can easily be found online). For someone with a wide foot I recommend knitting their shoe size in length but going up one size for the circumference, while for narrow feet use the next size down for the circumference.
